Middle School Book Report—Fiction

Book reports are to be typed, using Times New Roman and 12 Font. Book reports should also be double spaced. Please restate the question in your answer. (For example, Steve Smith was the protagonist of this story. He was a tall boy who walked with a limp.)

Students need to follow the outline below. Students must score a passing grade on their AR test in order to type a book report.

- 1. Book title in *italics* and author name.
- 2. Reading level and number of pages.
- 3. AR reading test score.
- 4. Describe the main setting for your book. Some stories have more than one setting, if it's an important setting, include them all.
- 5. Explain the mood of your book. Give an example from the story that would explain the mood.
- 6. The protagonist of a story is the main character. Who is the protagonist of the story?

 Describe the protagonist.
- 7. The antagonist of a story is the opponent of the protagonist. Who in the story causes the protagonist the most conflict? Describe the antagonist and what conflict(s) they cause.
- 8. Explain a conflict in the story.
- 9. Resolution of a conflict is how the conflict ends. In thinking about the main conflict of the story...were you pleased with the resolution? Why or why not?
- 10. How did you like this fiction book? Write a friendly letter, using the appropriate body style, to a friend. In your letter, provide two reasons why you would recommend this book to your friend or provide two reasons why you would not recommend this book to your friend. (Saying it is good or not good is not considered a good reason.)
