| Plot: A series of related events that make up a story. Plot tells us who the characters are and what their conflicts are. Plot also includes the climax and resolution. | | | |
| Theme: The truth about life revealed in a work of literature. What idea does the writer wish to convey about a particular subject. This is usually written in a sentence, not a word. | | | |
| Conflict: A struggle or clash between opposing characters or opposing forces. *External conflict is when a character struggles against some outside force. *Internal conflict is when the struggle takes place within a characters mind. | | | |
| Point of View: From whose point is the story told. *Omniscient point of view is when the narrator knows everything about the characters and what is happening everywhere else. *Third Person limited point of view | | | |

| <p>is when the narrator focuses on feelings and thoughts of only one character.</p> <p>*First person point of view is when a character is telling the story with use of personal pronouns such as I, me, mine, we, us, and ours.</p> | | | |
| <p>Mood: The overall emotion created by a work of literature. For example: sad, scary, hopeful, exciting, haunting, romantic, etc.</p> | | | |
